From the Chief... Jonathan M. Goldman, CPE



The first quarter of 2025 has been full of progress and momentum! Our collaboration with the New Hampshire Department of Safety and Public Works on the new building continues to move forward. While this is an exciting time, it's also a very busy one as we explore the best and most effective ways to fund the project and turn vision into reality. Many of us were able to attend the groundbreaking ceremony on April 7th. Work has finally begun on the site.

In early December, Deputy Chief Hannafin submitted our LRMFA Training Program to APCO International for recertification under the Agency Training Program Certification (ATPC). This certification is akin to an accreditation of both our new hire and continuing education programs. To achieve this recognition, agencies must meet or exceed over 111 ANSI standards—no small feat. We were thrilled to receive notification in late March that our program has officially been recertified. This marks our first recertification period, and it reflects the continued commitment and professionalism of our team.

In January, Dispatchers Hanson and Gannon, along with Deputy Chief Hannafin, had the opportunity to attend a live training burn in Loudon. While both Dispatchers had successfully completed our rigorous training program when they were hired, neither had field experience. This live burn provided a valuable opportunity to witness fire operations from the field side—enhancing their understanding of what responders are experiencing on the ground. Deputy Chief Hannafin also gained additional hands-on experience coordinating communications and working directly with the incident commander at the command post.

A big thank you goes out to Chief Blanchette and the Loudon Fire Department for welcoming our team and providing this meaningful experience.

We are continuing to roll out MDT's and Crewforce applications for mobile users, and the WebCAD training. With WebCAD users are able to obtain all of their call information and run reports through it. Faxing has become very expensive, and there are only a couple of agencies still receiving faxes. As such we will stop faxing to all agencies beginning July 1, 2025. LRMFA CELEBRATES THE BIRTHDAY OF 9-1-1

Happy Birthday to the emergency number 9-1-1. The first 9-1-1 call in the United States was made on February 16, 1968 in Haleyville, Alabama. The call was placed by Rankin Fite, the Speaker of the House for Alabama, and answered by Tom Bevill, a U.S. Representative.

The call was made from Haleyville City Hall to the local police station. The building that was used for the call later became Haleyville's City Hall. The call marked a significant moment in emergency response in the United States.

The American Telephone and Telegraph Company announced in 1968 that 9-1-1 would be reserved for contacting emergency services in its service areas. Six days after the first 9-1-1 call in the U.S., the second call was made in Alaska.





Looking for a Part-Time Job — Check us out!!!!! A new era for the Sanbornton Fire & Rescue

Sanbornton Fire & Rescue is a combination department made up of a full-time Fire Chief, a part time Deputy Chief/EMS Coordinator, 1 full time Lieutenant/Paramedic, 3 full time Firefighter/EMT's, 1 part time administrative assistant, 12 Per Diem Firefighter/EMS providers and 5 On-Call Firefighters and EMS providers.



The Sanbornton Fire & Rescue aggressively



current with an ambulance and Engine currently on order slated for delivery in 2026 and 2028 respectively.

In 2023 the residents of Sanbornton overwhelmingly supported the addition of two full-time firefighter/EMS providers to bring the full-time staffing to four which included coverage of the Central Station to 24 hours per day. Also, that year the Sanbornton Police Department moved out of the "Life Safey building" into their own space across the parking lot allowing us to expand and improve our administrative space and add two bunk rooms with room for four positions. Ultimately renaming the building the "Central Fire Station".

This year (2025) at the town meeting again the residents supported staffing needs with the addition of a 24-hour Per Diem shift, bringing staffing up to two firefighter/EMS providers 24-hours per day covering the Central Fire Station.



We are actively recruiting Per Diem (part-time) Firefighter/EMS providers for staffing 12 and/or 24-hour shifts.

Pay scale – per hour (due to state of NH restrictions can only work a maximum of 1,508 hours per year – average 29 hours per week). This new pay scale begins 7/1/2025

Firefighter/EMT - \$23.00 to 24.12 (\$34,684 to \$36,373) Based on 29 hours per week Firefighter/AEMT - \$24.60 to \$25.81 (\$37,100 to \$38,922) Based on 29 hours per week Firefighter/Paramedic - \$26.32 to 27.61 (\$39,691 to \$41,636) Based on 29 hours per week

Minimum requirements:

- 18 years of age
- High School diploma (or GED)
- NH Licensed provider at the EMT level (AEMT or Paramedic preferred)
- Valid NH driver's license
- Pro-Board Firefighter I (Firefighter II preferred, above pay scale base on FF II)
- <u>Highly self-motivated individuals</u> that can show a commitment to the town, our residents and the department.
