From the Chief...

As the 4th quarter of 2022 comes to a close, we realized it was probably one of the most trying quarters and periods LRMFA has ever experienced. As most know, Deputy Chief Paul D. Steele Jr. suffered a medical emergency and as we worked through that, we had to overcome challenges associated with it.

Lt. Erin Hannafin was promoted to Interim Operations Supervisor in early October. As it became clearer that Deputy Chief Steele's absence would be long term the decision was made to promote Interim Operations Supervisor Hannafin to the role of Acting Deputy Chief in early December. Deputy Chief Hannafin is learning her new role, and working to define that role, even if only temporarily and we wish her well.

The entire team at LRMFA has done an amazing job during the past few months, even though the uncertainty about what is or was going to happen. The LRMFA staff should be commended for their actions during this difficult time. There is light at the end of the tunnel, Deputy Chief Steele came home on January 17th, 2023. He will still need some time to continue his recovery, but by all accounts thus far his recovery has been miraculous and we wish him continued success.

In November of 2022, Dispatcher Samantha Prentice completed her training program and has been assigned to Lt. Ricky Fowler's shift. She is continuing to hone her skills and learning every day.

We continued to work with the NH Department of Safety and the State of NH as the sale of the property we are located on continued. The Executive Council along with Governor Sununu authorized 10 million dollars to come from ARPA funds to be put towards the construction of the new building, and in last year's legislative session, an amendment was passed allowing proceeds of the sale of this property to be used to offset the design and construction of the new building. Media reports show that the current property has been sold or will be sold for approximately 23 million dollars. We will continue to work with our partners at the state level as this situation progresses.

Each year for the past few years we have played a game on social media to see who can guess which department will have the first call of the year and at what time. PIO Lt. Kevin Nugent ran the “game” this year, and Rochester NH Scanner Alert won. The first call of 2023 went to Strafford Fire Department at 0002. The prize, according to Lt. Nugent is “one year’s worth of bragging rights.” Thank you to all who “played” the game, and again congratulations to Rochester NH Scanner Alert.

Lt. Dave Parker has begun working with Tyler Technologies to begin the implementation of our new CAD program, which is scheduled to “Go Live” in October of 2023. We are still on schedule with the implementation, and I know everyone is looking forward to the success of the program.

On December 23rd a large weather event came through the State of NH and in the first 22 hours of the storm leading into Christmas LRMFA quintupled its typical daily call volume and dispatched 464 emergency calls for service. During these 22 hours, we had as many as seven highly trained Emergency Dispatchers working within the operations room working to coordinate emergency responses throughout the district including two building fires, one of which rose to a 3rd alarm. For the next twelve hours, LRMFA personnel dispatched 123 emergency calls for service which included two additional building fires. LRMFA is always proud of our team, and the critical lifesaving work they do every day, this 36-hour period demonstrated the skills and ability of our team.

As 2023 begins we look forward to what this year will bring, with the new CAD system, work towards co-locating in a new building with NH9-1-1, Deputy Chief Steele’s continued healing, some great programs hosted by the training division... 2023 is shaping up to be the best year yet at LRMFA. 

2023 RADIO MDC PROJECT

Starting in February of 2023, LRMFA will be rebuilding the radio identification (radio alias) in our computer system. For us to provide the best possible service to our departments, we have to take advantage of all the possible tools we have at our disposal. One of these tools is the ability to identify the radio that is communicating with us. The main goal of this project is to collect all the mobile and portable radio MDC numbers and have them entered into our system. When the radio is in use, it will identify with either apparatus or personnel information during day-to-day radio traffic as well as emergencies.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO?

You will need to schedule a date for me to come out to your station. I will need all mobile and portable radios available during the scheduled time to obtain the MDC numbers. My goal is to see this project completed by July 2023. This is an important project to complete and for us to be successful we need each department’s assistance. Together we better our communication and increase safety. I look forward to working with everyone.

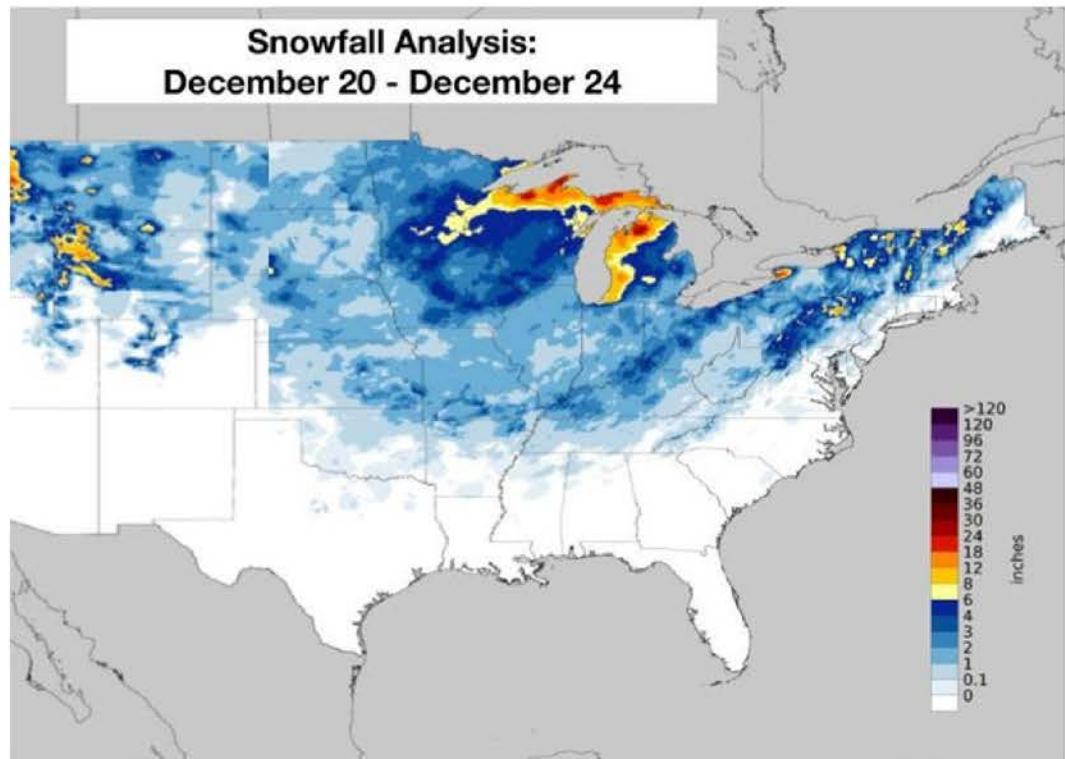


LRMFA QUINTUPLE DAILY CALL VOLUME DURING WINTER STORM ELLIOTT

Starting at 0230 on December 23, 2022, Winter Storm Elliott started affecting the lakes region area. LRMFA was staffed at our normal staffing levels of a Lieutenant and Dispatcher. At 09:38 Lieutenant Fowler requested additional staff to the communications center, this brought in Deputy Chief Hannafin and Dispatcher Sattler. At 17:30 another recall for dispatchers was requested this brought in Lieutenant Nugent, Dispatcher Dumka, and Chief Goldman. At the peak of the storm, we had 7 people staffing the operations room. For calls, we had multiple trees on wires, wires down, trees down, fire alarm activations, an odor of gas in the buildings, trees on houses, electrical problems, floodings in roads and homes, as well as medical incidents. During this weather event, Chief Goldman also responded to a 3rd alarm building fire in Strafford. This storm resulted in major infrastructure damage, and recovery efforts from the utility companies continued for multiple days through Christmas. Many residents did not have power restored until after Christmas. As a result of this storm air travel was paralyzed throughout the country and especially in the northeast. A special thank you to Wilkinson-Beane Funeral Home and Cremation Services as well as Remix Nutrition for providing lunch and drinks for the staff. LRMFA staff are always heard, but often forgotten during incidents like this, and the staff was very appreciative of the refreshment.

In the first 22 hours of the storm, we handled: 464 calls for service; 403 Emergency phone calls; 307 Administrative phone calls; 742 Radio Transmissions; 4 Smoke in the buildings; 1 Building Fire; 1 3rd Alarm Building Fire

For today's first twelve hours of the second day of the storm, we handled: 123 Calls for service; 120 Emergency phone calls; 96 Administrative phone calls; 1 Smoke in the Building; 2 Building Fires

3RD ALARM FIRE IN STRAFFORD



On December 23 at approximately 2230 the Strafford Fire Department was dispatched to a reported building fire on Strafford Road. Strafford companies were previously committed mutual aid to Northwood, LRMFA had multiple Dispatchers working due to the evening storms, and took two calls on the fire. One call was from the homeowner, and the second call was from a passerby reporting the building was fully involved. Strafford companies responding requested a First Alarm while en route. Upon arriving on the scene the first arriving companies requested a second alarm, and eventually, 25C1 requested a third alarm. Multiple mutual aid departments responded, along with LRMFA C1 who was already on the air returning from the communications center due to storm activity.

Companies aggressively fought the fire in a building that was fully involved on arrival, eventually stopping the fire at the breezeway protecting the garage. Access to the building was difficult compounded by the cold temperatures and building layout. Mutual aid was released beginning at around 0230, and Strafford companies remained on the scene for several more hours.

LRMFA and the Capital Area Fire Mutual Aid Compact provide joint oversight for the Central NH HazMat Team. Member communities of each district are automatically provided HAZMAT services. The Team has been busy this quarter with multiple incidents in both districts. At 1133 hrs on December 9 the Central NH Hazmat Team responded to Epsom for a Motor Vehicle Accident involving a Gasoline Tank Truck that was sideswiped by another vehicle.

There was a concern about the integrity of the Tanker and that its load may have to be transferred to another tanker. After assessing the Tanker it was determined to be intact and its load did not require to be transferred to another Tanker. The Incident was placed under control at 1:38 pm and all Hazmat Units and personnel were clear of the incident.

New Hampshire 9-1-1 encourages you to check your smartphone settings before you hit the mountains for some winter fun! Dispatch agencies all around the country are reporting an increase in abandoned emergency calls from skiers who have crash detection features included on newer-model smartphones. Familiarize yourself with these features and enable them accordingly so that falls on the mountain will not dial emergency services. If you are ever in a scenario where your device has dialed 9-1-1 and there is no emergency, always stay on the line and inform the telecommunicator of the mistake. You cannot hang up fast enough and our telecommunicators will contact you by phone call or text to find out if you have an emergency. Stay safe and have fun on the slopes!
